#### **Summer Cultural Immersion Trips**

Cultural immersion travel has been part of NECS summer programming since 2022. We expose our students to various cultures and stories, aiming to nurture empathy for people different from themselves while they serve the community they visit.

#### **Civil Rights Journey to Alabama**

During a service-learning trip to Montgomery, Selma, Birmingham, and Tuskegee, participants explored the Civil Rights Movement, connecting with local historians and activists to learn more about our nation's history. Organized with three other youth service organizations— Westchester Youth Alliance, Hitchcock Presbyterian, and Kol Ami Congregation—this trip united youth from Westchester with peers from Alabama's More than a Horse Farm program. This experience provided insights into marginalized communities' struggles and triumphs, and the youth collaborated on creating a documentary film of their journey.

#### Learning About Indigenous History in South Dakota

NECS partnered with the Oceti Wakan Mission to take seven teenage girls to Pine Ridge. In our schools, Native American history and the challenges faced by indigenous peoples are often overlooked. Our girls immersed themselves in the Lakota people's history, culture, and traditions during their five-day stay. They connected with their native peers, gaining insights into reservation life and the land's history.

#### **Professional Development**

At the start of each season, our teaching artists and administrative team came together for transformative professional development workshops. We focused on fostering a nurturing, equitable, and imaginative space for our students. Central to our discussions was the importance of acknowledging the inherent dignity of every individual and infusing every interaction with compassion, all while upholding a sense of structure in the classroom.

We delved deep into our core values, exploring ways to seamlessly integrate them into our lesson plans, enriching the educational experience. Through this collaborative effort, we strengthened our bonds as a team and laid the foundation for a more cohesive and supportive community within our organization.

#### **Peekskill Open Studios**

#### Student Exhibit

The Peekskill Open Studios is an annual event held during the first weekend of June, where local artists showcase their work. Hundreds of people visit Peekskill annually to meet artists, buy art, and learn about the art scene. NECS student artwork was showcased at the event, allowing community members to admire our students' creative endeavors. We want our students to see their work exhibited and feel proud of their artistic achievements.

#### **Youth Theater Collaborative**

Every year for four months, we put on a theatre production, introducing students to the joy and magic of theatre. This season, our students chose the musical comedy Cyrano de Burger Shack, a modern retelling of Cyrano de Bergerac by Edmond Rostand. We opened to four sold-out, laughter and musicfilled performances at the Studio Theater in Exile at Hudson Valley MOCA.

We welcomed over 30 eager students to our Nature Connection Camp in the summer. From invigorating hikes to refreshing swims, every moment was filled with joy and discovery as they explored the wonders of nature. Engaging in creative art projects allowed them to unleash their imaginations and share the happiness of self-expression. Tranquil yoga sessions provided moments of serenity, fostering peace within themselves and among their peers. Tending to gardens instilled a sense of responsibility and pride as they nurtured life around them. Mastering paddle boarding, kayaking, and sailing brought immense joy to the middle schoolers and taught valuable lessons in perseverance and teamwork, creating cherished memories of summer success.

#### **My Activist Life Podcast**

We launched a podcast in 2023. **"My Activist Life"** was initiated and hosted by NECS students Ariana Okoth and Helena Steger to serve as a platform for amplifying the voices and experiences of youth. Through candid conversations and insightful discussions, this podcast empowers young people to share their stories, advocate for Social Justice, and challenge systemic inequalities. The podcast's first season, released in the summer of 2023, sheds light on pressing issues and provides a vital platform for youth voices.

#### Peekskill Police Department Empowers Girls

One of the highlights of the Girls Empowered program was a session led by Sargent Carter's team from the Peekskill Police Department. The officers' sensitive approach took into consideration the girls' age and emotional well-being as they provided an informative presentation on human trafficking realities and injustices. This crucial session equipped teen girls with knowledge about signs, risks, and preventive measures, empowering them to protect themselves, and they learned how to advocate for their peers if they notice signs of abuse.

#### **Thanksgiving Service**

Our youth joined Westchester Youth Alliance for their Thanksgiving Service Event. They assisted in preparing over 2000 holiday meals meals for 20 food pantries. Witnessing the passion and kindness of our youth in serving others, we emphasize the significance of instilling a sense of responsibility, molding them into future leaders who appreciate the importance of contributing to their community.

#### **Community Day at Peekskill Regeneration Farm**

Peekskill Regeneration Farm and New Era Creative Space united to present a Community Day centered on community service through nourishing people and the planet. Through this collaboration, we aimed to highlight the vital role of feeding the community while cultivating environmental stewardship. The event featured cooking demonstrations by Feeding Westchester, utilizing fresh garden produce, alongside engaging workshops on arts and crafts, seeding, and planting. Attendees enjoyed music, games, and a vibrant atmosphere, all in the spirit of fostering connections and spreading positivity.

# **Growth & Expansion**

In 2023, the New Era Creative Space team guided programs from inspiration to reality. Our team's dedication and innovative spirit inspire young hearts and minds, foster meaningful relationships, and cultivate a vibrant community network.

Alongside the highlighted programs, we offered numerous workshops and initiatives throughout the year, including a lighting workshop led by a professional filmmaker, healthy manhood training with **A Call to Men**, a monthly community yoga class open to all, and stress management workshops with the **Peekskill NAACP**. A local photographer, **Rana Faure**, joined our team to introduce still life and portrait photography to enthusiastic middle school students. These additional endeavors provided diverse learning experiences and support to our students and the community.

We also extended our support to afterschool programs, collaborating with school districts and institutions to serve more children. At **Peekskill City School District**, we provided afterschool arts programs at the middle and two elementary schools on Tuesdays through Fridays.


Additionally, we expanded our program at the **Peekskill Housing Authority Community Room at Dunbar Heights** three days a week, offering visual art and introducing yoga and mindfulness. For the third year, we have continued our partnership with **The Children's Village's Jackson Rapid Intervention Center**, offering therapeutic theatre programs for children who have experienced trauma. 
# **Financial Report**


# Looking to the Future »
